



Box of French: J'aime les sports! is a set of six 30-minute French lessons designed to take learners from word level to short text level. It is designed for Key Stage 2 learners (age 7-11) but could also be used successfully with Key Stage 3 (age 11-14) or as a transition unit. It enables learners to make some elements of the “substantial progress” outlined in the Programme of Study for Key Stage 2 Languages.

The lessons focus on the Olympics, the names of sports and how to give opinions of these sports. By the end of these six lessons, learners will be able to write and say extended sentences about their opinions of sports, using connectives and justifying their opinions with adjectives.

Each of the six lessons has a detailed lesson plan, a PowerPoint presentation and resources such as worksheets and flashcards. Audio is also provided to support the non-specialist teacher. Some points to note:

- The lesson plans show the “I can” statements by which teachers can assess and record the progress that children have made.
- The lesson plans list the vocabulary used in each lesson. The vocabulary is divided into two sections. The transferable vocabulary is that which can be used in many other topic areas, while the non-transferable vocabulary is specific to this topic area.
- The lesson plans are each intended to last for 30 minutes. Follow-up and extension resources and suggestions are given in order to extend the teaching time if necessary.
- Each lesson plan is cross-referenced to the objectives of the Key Stage 2 Languages Programme of Study and the relevant objectives of the Key Stage 2 Framework for Languages.
- Glossaries are provided in French-English and English-French format for children to use to facilitate their learning.
- Most worksheets are available in two ability levels. The second worksheet in each case is the lower level.
- Answers are given to all worksheet activities
